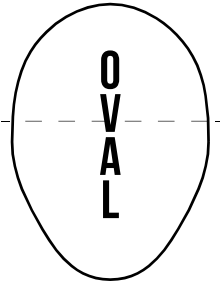

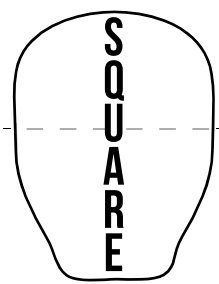

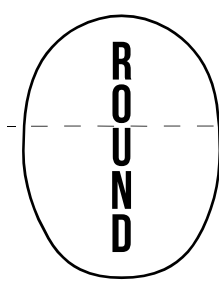

Round faces have the opposite effect — they have little to no sharp edges and are full all the way around. Angular frames, such as square lenses, flatter and balance a round face and wide frames help balance fullness and frames with contrasting colors or ones with a cat-eye shape to add a visual lift to a rounder face. Stay away from frames that are curvy or round, which will further emphasize a fuller face. Celebrity with this face shape: Michelle Williams and Queen Latifah.

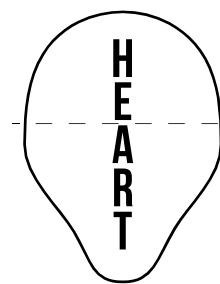

Heart faces are wide at the forehead and cheekbones and become narrow at the chin. Frames that broaden a narrow jaw without playing up the width of the forehead, such as aviators, butterfly or rimless shades are good options. Try to stay away from a small frame on a heart-shaped face because it will exaggerate the width the face. Celebrity with this face shape: Reese Witherspoon.

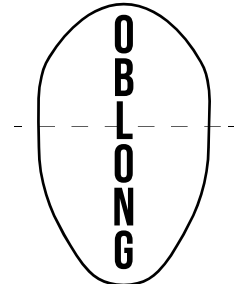

Oblong faces are more narrow and long than wide characterized by high cheekbones, a strong jaw line and raised forehead. Sporting oversized round frames, wrap around "shield" frames, or frames with contrasting color and embellishment help to create the illusion of a wider, shorter face. Avoid narrow or small frames—they only emphasize length.
